



District Expands Use of Recycled Water

LAGUNA NIGUEL, Calif. (July 1, 2010) – Three recent projects by MNWD will save more than 85 million gallons of drinking water each year and reduce the District’s dependence on costly and less reliable sources of imported water.

Two of MNWD’s largest water users, the United Parcel Service and Saddleback Valley Unified School District, will save a combined 28 million gallons of domestic water each year by converting to recycled water for landscape irrigation. MNWD is also beginning this month to install three additional miles of purple recycled-water pipelines in Mission Viejo and Laguna Hills, bringing recycled water to even more industrial and municipal customers. The expansion will save approximately 57 million additional gallons of domestic water.
