### **2009 Certificates of Participation (Build America Bonds)**

- The 2009 Certificates of Participation ("2009 COPs") were issued to fund:
  - IRWD Interconnection
  - Baker Water Treatment Plant
  - Upper Chiquita Emergency Storage Reservoir
- The 2009 COPs were issued as taxable Build America Bonds
  - Expectation of receiving a federal subsidy equal to 35% of the interest cost
  - The subsidy has been curtailed between 6.2% and 8.7% since 2013
- \$60 million of principal outstanding with final maturity of September 1, 2039
- The 2009 COPs are eligible to be refunded today
  - Advance refundings are no longer permitted following 2017 tax reform
  - Propose refunding the 2009 COPs using the Extraordinary Optional Redemption

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## **Proposed Refunding of the 2009 COPs**

- Opportunity to refund for savings
  - Low current interest rates
  - Strength of MNWD credit = Fitch "AAA"
- Propose negotiated method of sale
  - ✓ Enhanced outreach
  - ✓ Timing of sale flexibility


## Single Family Residential Accounts Above Tier 2














## Total Turf Removal Application Size by Month







#### **Residential Indoor Devices**




#### **Residential Indoor Dollars**






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
#### **Commercial Indoor Devices**






