RESOLUTION NO. 09-06

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF MOULTON NIGUEL WATER DISTRICT ADOPTING AND CERTIFYING DISTRICT'S SEWER SYSTEM MANAGEMENT PLAN (SSMP)

WHEREAS, pursuant to California Water District Law, Section 34000 et seq. of the California Water Code, the Moulton Niguel Water District ("District") has the authority to own and operate sewer systems and to adopt rules and regulations for the management of sewer systems;

WHEREAS, sanitary sewer overflows ("SSOs"), caused by discharges of wastewater containing high levels of Fats, Oils and Grease ("FOG"), tree roots, and other debris and pollutants, may cause temporary exceedances of applicable water quality objectives, pose a threat to the public health, adversely affect aquatic life, and impair the public recreational use and aesthetic enjoyment of surface waters;

WHEREAS, State Water Resources Control Board Order No. 2006-0003-DWQ, Statewide General Waste Discharge Requirements for Sanitary Sewer Systems, as revised by Order No. WQ 2008-0002-EXEC ("State WDR Order") establishes the primary State regulatory mechanism for sanitary sewer systems and the prevention of SSOs, and includes the general requirement for Sewer System Management Plans (SSMPs) to provide a plan and schedule to properly manage, operate, and maintain all parts of sanitary sewer systems, including a SSO emergency response plan;

WHEREAS, a specific element of the SSMPs requires a FOG Control Program to monitor and control SSOs that could result from FOG discharge, and the District completed a FOG Control Program approved by the Board of Directors of the District by adoption of Resolution No. 08-41 on November 20, 2008;

WHEREAS, the District Operations Staff, assisted by other District Divisions, has prepared the "Moulton Niguel Water District Sewer System Management Plan" ("District SSMP") pursuant to the State WDR Order, which includes the District's FOG Control Program and terms for the implementation of the plans and programs set forth in the District SSMP;

WHEREAS, the District SSMP has been presented to the Board of Directors for its review at a duly noticed public meeting held on this date;

WHEREAS, District Operations Staff confirms that the District SSMP including the subparts and elements, as well as the implementation of those terms, are in compliance with the requirements of the State WDR Order and are in accordance with the time frames identified in the schedules set forth in the State WDR Order; and

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WHEREAS, the adoption and certification of the District's SSMP is exempt under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to (i) Section 15308 of the CEQA Guidelines that provide a categorical exemption for actions taken by a regulatory agency as authorized by state or local ordinance to assure the maintenance, restoration, enhancement or protection of the environment; and (ii) Section 15301 of the CEQA Guidelines to the extent that it applies to existing sanitary sewer collection systems of the District that constitute "existing facilities" as that term is used in Section 15301, and Section 15302, to the extent that it results in the repair or replacement of existing sewer system facilities of the District involving negligible or no expansion of capacity.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Directors of the Moulton Niguel Water District does hereby RESOLVE, DETERMINE and ORDER as follows:

<u>Section 1.</u> The Recitals and the facts set forth in the Recitals are incorporated in this Section 1 by this reference.

Section 2. The Board of Directors approves and adopts the District SSMP, including the implementation provisions set forth in the District SSMP, and based on information from the District Operations Staff, certifies that the District SSMP and the subparts and elements, as well as the implementation of those terms, are in compliance with the requirements of the State WDR Order, and are also in accordance with the time frames identified in the schedule set forth in the State WDR Order.

Section 3. The Board of Directors finds the adoption of the District SSMP is a categorically exempt project under CEQA based on the following facts and findings: (1) the District SSMP applies to sanitary sewer collection systems of the District that constitute "existing facilities" of the District, or may require the installation of minor sewer system facilities which will constitute either minor alterations to existing facilities, or result in repair or replacement of existing facilities involving negligible or no expansion of sewer capacity; and (2) the District SSMP requires the implementation of management and operation programs and plans to enhance and protect the environment by limiting the occurrence of SSOs in the District, which pose a threat to public health, may cause temporary exceedances of applicable water quality objectives, adversely affect aquatic life and impair the public recreational use and aesthetic enjoyment of surface waters. The Board of Directors authorizes and directs the Secretary of the District in consultation with the Director of Operations and legal counsel to file a Notice of Exemption with the County of Orange in accordance with State CEQA Guidelines and District procedures.

Section 4. The Director of Operations is hereby directed to take all further actions required under the State WDR Order to complete the certification of compliance of the District SSMP, the implementation programs and plans, and the time schedule, as set forth in Section 2 above.

Section 5. The provisions of this Resolution shall be effective immediately upon adoption.


